CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is To Certify, That JOHN E. Mc GAIGE

of Flying Hst Ranch, Mt. Vernon, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of John Day River a tributary of Columbia River for the purpose of irrigation of 9.1 acres and supplemental irrigation of 236.9 acres under Permit No. 28768 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from April 18, 1963

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 3.19 cubic feet per second; being 0.23 c.f.s. for primary irrigation and 2.96 c.f.s. for supplemental irrigation

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 23; NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 26, T. 13 S., R. 29 E., W. M. Diversion points located 200 feet West and 710 feet North; 3360 feet West and 690 feet South; both from the NE Corner, Section 26.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year; provided further that the right to use of water is limited to the period when the flow of the John Day River is more than 30 c.f.s. at USGS Gage No. 14-0465 and more than 20 c.f.s. at USGS Gage No. 14-0480;

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Certificate of water right issued to John E. McCaige and recorded at page 35802, Volume 27, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms the right to the use of water for irrigation of 290.0 acres. Subsequently, the right to the use of water appurtenant to 44.0 acres was canceled by order of the State Engineer entered June 30, 1969. This certificate is issued to confirm the remaining right to the use of water for irrigation and supersedes the certificate heretofore issued to John E. McCaige.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
