CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That GREEN VALLEY FARMS

of P. O. Box 709, Myrtle Creek, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of unnamed stream and reservoir constructed under Application No. R-42801, Permit No. R-4753 a tributary of South Umpqua River for the purpose of domestic use of two families and stock

under Permit No. 31275 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from September 14, 1966

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second, being 0.01 c.f.s. for domestic and 0.01 c.f.s. for stock

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 17, T. 30 S., R. 4 W., W. M. Diversion point located 3030 feet South and 930 feet West from NE Corner, Section 17.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Domestic NE 1/4 NE 1/4  
Stock NW 1/4 NE 1/4 as projected within Thorn DLC 44  
Domestic NE 1/4 NW 1/4 as projected within Chapman DLC 43  
Section 17  
T. 30 S., R. 4 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
