**CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT**

**This Is to Certify, That**      **WALTER W. FOSTER**

of 3323 Belvedere Street, N. W. Salem, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of a spring

a tributary of Willamette River for the purpose of orchard spraying and domestic use in pickers camp including the irrigation of not to exceed ½ acre lawn and garden under Permit No. 31580 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 18, 1966

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.04 cubic foot per second, being 0.03 c.f.s. for spraying and 0.01 c.f.s. for domestic

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE¼ NW¼, Section 30, T. 7 S., R. 3 W., W. M. Spring located: South 74° 40', West 3160 feet from the NE Corner, Section 30.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to \_\_\_\_\_ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Domestic and Orchard Spraying NE¼ NW¼  
Orchard Spraying NW¼ NE¼  
Orchard Spraying Lot 7 (SW¼ NW¼)  
Orchard Spraying Lot 6 (SE¼ NW¼)  
Section 30  
T. 7 S., R. 3 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
