CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That LAURAL HILL DITCH COMPANY

of Murphy, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of a tributary of Williams Creek for the purpose of supplemental irrigation under Permit No. 5434 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon and duly confirmed by order of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, made and entered of record in the Record of Proceedings of said Board, at Salem, in Volume 1, at page 447, on the 15th day of November, 1922; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 8, 1922

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.50 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the lands under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:

1 1/2 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section One, Township Thirty-eight South, Range Five; 1 1/2 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter; 2 1/2 acres in the Northwest quarter of Southeast quarter and 8 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Thirty-five; 1/2 acre in the Northeast quarter of Northeast quarter and 6 1/2 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Thirty-four; 8 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Twenty-seven; 5 acres in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter and 3 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-eight and 3 1/2 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Twenty-one, Township Thirty-seven South, Range Five; All West of Willamette Meridian, in Josephine County, Oregon, containing in all 40 acres of land.

(NOTE: The amount of water used under this right, together with the amount obtained from other sources of supply, for the same land, shall not exceed one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre.)

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That LAURAL HILL DITCH COMPANY

of the County of Josephine, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of

Williams Creek a tributary of Applegate River for the purpose of supplemental irrigation under Permit No. 5434 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon and duly confirmed by order of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, made and entered of record in the Record of Proceedings of said Board, at Salem, in Volume 447, at page 447, on the 15th day of November, 1922, that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 8, 1922

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.50 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

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Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.
