CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That OREGON STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION
Landscape Section, Construction Division
of Highway Building, Salem, State of Oregon, has made proof
to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of
Neil Creek Rest Area Well

a tributary of Neil Creek for the purpose of
irrigation of 2.6 acres

under Permit No. G-2837 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby
confirmed dates from March 9, 1965

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed
0.03 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.
The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 31, T. 39 S., R. 2 E., W. M.
Well located: 340 feet South and 1000 feet West from Center Corner, Section
31.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second
per acre, its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited
to a diversion of not to exceed 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated
during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall
conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is
appurtenant, is as follows:

2.6 acres NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 31
T. 39 S., R. 2 E., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
