CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

**This Is to Certify, That** EDWARD HINES LUMBER COMPANY  
Grant County Division  
of 422 W. Main, John Day, State of Oregon 97845, has made proof  
to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of  
John Day River and Edward Hines Pond #2 constructed under application number  
R-46147, permit number R-5487  
a tributary of Columbia River for the purpose of  
sprinkling log decks, fire protection, and operating boilers for steam vats  
under Permit No. 34477 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters  
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby  
confirmed dates from June 23, 1969

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes  
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed  
0.92 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.  
The point of diversion is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ; NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 27, T. 13 S., R.  
30 E., W. M., River - 910 feet South and 410 feet East; Reservoir - 990 feet  
South and 2560 feet West, both from N $\frac{1}{2}$  Corner, Section 27.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other  
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second  
per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is  
appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of  
use herein described.
