of City Hall, Baker, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Goodrich Reservoir constructed under application number R-34873, permit number R-2615

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 27371 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from Hay 4, 1961

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 233.2 acre feet stored water only to be appropriated at a rate of not to exceed 10.8 cubic feet per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NEX SEX, Section 4, T. 9 S., R. 38 E., W. M., 120 feet South and 1020 feet West from Ex Corner, Section 4.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
