of Box 202, Jordan Valley , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Spring Creek

a tributary of East Pine Creek (Pine Creek) (Snake River) for the purpose of irrigation of 6.4 acres & supplemental irrigation of 3.6 acres

under Permit No. 29538 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from April 1, 1964

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.25 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NWL NEL, Section 10, T. & S., R. 46 E., W. M.; 440 feet North and 30 feet East from SW Corner, Section 10.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount cured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 42 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A desciption of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right in appurtenant, is as follows:
