## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That PAUL S. SEELEY

of 144 North 19th Street, Portland, State of Oregon, 97208, has a right  
to the use of the waters of Queens Branch

a tributary of Pleasant Creek for the purpose of  
irrigation of 7.6 acres, and domestic  
and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for  
Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of  
the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 4, at page 1; that the priority of the right thereby  
confirmed dates from 1899

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an  
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.13 cubic foot per  
second.

The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 8, T. 35 S., R. 4 W., W. M.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as  
follows:

7.6 acres SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$   
Section 8  
T. 35 S., R. 4 W., W. M.

Certificate of water right issued to Paul S. Seeley and recorded at page 16136,  
Volume 13, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms the right to the  
use of water for irrigation of 10.0 acres. A change in the point of diversion  
for the irrigation of 2.4 acres was approved by order of the State Engineer entered  
April 23, 1973. This certificate is issued to confirm the remaining right to the  
use of water for irrigation and to confirm a change in point of diversion approved  
by an order of the State Engineer entered April 29, 1957 and supersedes the certificate  
heretofore issued to Paul S. Seeley.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.  
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place  
of use herein described.
