CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That ~~HELD J.~~ and JEAN M. PUDERBAUGH

of Box 391, Enterprise, 97828, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of the waters of Hurricane Creek

a tributary of Wallowa River for the purpose of irrigation of 35 acres

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Wallowa County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 5, at page 178; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1896

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1 1/2 acre feet per acre during any period of 30 days prior to July 31st of each year, and thereafter not to exceed 1 acre foot per acre during the entire remainder of the irrigation season; and said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The point of diversion is located in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 3, T. 3 S., R. 44 E., W. M., South 76 degrees 02 minutes West, 49 feet from the NE Corner, Section 3. A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

35.0 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 36 T. 2 S., R. 44 E., W. M.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in point of diversion approved by an order of the State Engineer entered August 31, 1970, and supersedes certificate of water right heretofore issued to F. H. Lanphear and recorded at page 3081, Volume 4, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
