CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That SLUSHER BORTHERS

of Dufur, State of Oregon, 97021, has a right to the use of the waters of Fifteen Mile Creek

a tributary of Columbia River for the purpose of irrigation of 22.0 acres and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Wasco County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 7, at page 406; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from March 4, 1861

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed three acre feet per acre in any irrigation season.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

22.0 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 32 T. 1 S., R. 13 E., W. M.

Certificate of water right issued to Slusher Brothers and recorded at page 5666, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms the right to the use of water for irrigation of 99.6 acres. The right appurtenant to 17.1 acres was canceled by order of the State Engineer entered June 8, 1964. A change in the point of diversion for the irrigation of 60.5 acres was approved by order of the State Engineer entered April 16, 1973. This certificate is issued to confirm the remaining right to the use of water for irrigation and supersedes the certificate heretofore issued to Slusher Brothers.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
