CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That H. B. CRANSTON ESTATE AND EARL F. CRANSTON
of Baker, State of Oregon has a right to the use of
the waters of Balm Creek and Clover Creek, tributaries of Powder River
for the purpose of the irrigation of 115.5 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291;
that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1891 for Tract No. 1 and 1892
for Tract No. 2

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot
per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations
contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appur-
tenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract No. 1 from Balm Creek: 2 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest
quarter of Section Twenty-four; 22 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northwest
quarter; 8.5 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter; 38 acres in
the Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter and 20 acres in the Southeast quarter
of Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-five, Township Eight South, Range Forty-two
East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2 from Clover Creek: 25 acres in the Southeast quarter of North-
east quarter of Section Twenty-six, Township Eight South, Range Forty-two East of
Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

(Tract No. 1 is supplemented by water from Clover Creek, stored in Cranston
Reservoir on Clover Creek under date of 1892 for 3 acres and Tract No. 2 is sup-
plemented by water from Powder River through Phillips, Brown & Cranston Ditch,
under date of 1901)

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place
of use herein described.
