CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That **ELDON EARL DAVIS**

of **Route 1, Box 145 C, Pendleton**, State of **Oregon**, **97801**, has made proof to the satisfaction of the **STATE ENGINEER** of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of **an unnamed slough**

a tributary of **Umatilla River** for the purpose of **irrigation of 4.0 acres**

under Permit No. **30588** of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from **June 25, 1965**

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed **0.05 cubic foot per second**

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the **NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 8, T. 2 N., R. 33 E., W. M., 2350 feet North and 170 feet West from E $\frac{1}{2}$ Corner, Section 8.**

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to **one-eightieth** of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

T. 2 N., R. 33 E., W. M.**

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
