CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That CHARLES WILHELM

of **Route 1, Box 213, Sheridan**, State of **Oregon**, ⁹⁷³⁷⁸ has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of an ~~unnamed~~ stream, a spring, and a reservoir constructed under Application No. **R-49436, Permit No. E-6014** a tributary of **Gooseneck Creek** for the purpose of **stock and fish culture**

under Permit No. **37104** of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from **July 11, 1972**

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed **0.02 cubic foot per second, being 0.01 c.f.s. for stock and 0.01 c.f.s. for fish culture**

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the **Lot 5 (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$), Section 32, T. 6 S., R. 6 W., W. M., Spring-130 feet North and 530 feet West, Stream and Reservoir-460 feet North and 440 feet West, both from SE Corner, Lot 5 (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$).**

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

**Lot 5 (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$)
Section 32
T. 6 S., R. 6 W., W. M.**

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
