CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That PETL! HANSEN

of Haines , State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Rock Creek and Willow Creek, tributary of Powder River

for the purpose of the irrigation of 56 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for

Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291;
that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1902 for Tract No. 1 and 1883
for Tract No. 2

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract No. 1 from Rock Creek: 12 acres in the Northwest quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Thirty-four, Township Seven South, Range Thirty-eight East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2 from Wills Creek: 35.5 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter and 8.5 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section Three, Township Eight South, Range Thirty-eight East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
