Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291;
that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1878 for 25 acres; 1883 for
20 acres; 1883 for 75 acres; 1883 for 15 acres and 1902 for 25 acres

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

40 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section Nine:

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
