CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That D. FRED INDERMUHL

of Baker, State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Washington Gulch, tributary of Powder River, and Powder River, tributary of Snake River for the purpose of the irrigation of 130 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1875 for Tract No. 1 and 1886 for Tract No. 2

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract No. 1 from Washington Gulch. 30 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northwest quarter of Section Eleven and 40 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Two, Township Nine South, Range Thirty-nine East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2 from Powder River: 32 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northeast quarter and 28 acres in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Twelve, Township Nine South, Range Thirty-nine East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

(Tract No. 1 also has supplemental supply through Pocahontus Farmers Ditch from Mill, Marble & Goodrich Creeks, under date of 1906)

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
