CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That WAYNE HIEBENTHAL

of Rt. 1 Box 316, Dallas, State of Oregon, 97338, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of an unnamed stream and Hiebenthal Reservoir constructed under Application No. R-48844, Permit No. R-5925 a tributary of Salt Creek for the purpose of domestic use for one family and stock

under Permit No. 36603 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from November 11, 1971 that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second, being 0.01 c.f.s. for domestic and 0.01 c.f.s. for stock

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, as projected within Kennedy DLC 74, Section 3, T. 7 S., R. 5 W., W. M., 2190 feet South and 2080 feet West from NE Corner, Kennedy DLC 60, T. 6 S., R. 5 W., W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to _____ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
