CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That JESS C. AND CLARA M. BYERS

of Rt. 2 Box 209, Dexter, State of Oregon, 97431, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of Lost Creek

a tributary of Middle Fork Willamette River for the purpose of irrigation of 2.6 acres

under Permit No. 36199 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 4, 1971

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 28, T. 19 S., R. 1 W., W. M., 630 feet North and 230 feet West from the S $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner, Section 28.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-cubictenth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

2.6 acres SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 28
T. 19 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
