CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That

EDWIN D. JONES

of 10351 Hwy. 238, Jacksonville, State of Oregon, 97530, has
a right to the use of the waters of
Applegate River

a tributary of Rogue River for the purpose of
irrigating 26.9 acres

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of
the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 16, at page 523; that the priority of the
right thereby confirmed dates from 1902;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.54 cubic foot per
second.

The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 29, T. 38 S., R. 3 W., W. M.,
1260 feet North and 1540 feet East from the SE Corner, Long DLC 39.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as
follows:

15.0 acres NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$
11.9 acres W $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 29
T. 38 S., R. 3 W., W. M.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in point of diversion approved by
an order of the State Engineer entered December 15, 1967 and supersedes certificate
of water right heretofore issued to Ray and Maybelle Offenbacher, and recorded at
Page 32903, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established
by the Water Policy Review Board. WITNESS the signature of the Water Resources Director, affixed
