## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

**This Is to Certify, That**

N. A. MCLEOD

of Grants Pass, State of Oregon, 97526, has  
a right to the use of the waters of  
Slate Creek

a tributary of Applegate River for the purpose of  
irrigating 2.0 acres

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for  
Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of  
the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 16, at page 523; that the priority of the  
right thereby confirmed dates from 1908;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an  
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.04 cubic foot per  
second.

The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 1, T. 37 S., R. 7 W., W. M.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as  
follows:

2.0 acres NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$   
Section 6  
T. 37 S., R. 6 W., W. M.

An order of the Water Resources Director entered February 17, 1976 approved a  
change in point of diversion for the irrigation of 6.0 acres. This certificate  
is issued to confirm the remaining right not involved in the change and  
supersedes the certificate heretofore issued to N. A. McLeod recorded at  
Page 32929, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.  
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of  
use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies  
established by the Water WITNESS the signature of the Water Resources Director, affixed  
Policy Review Board.
