CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That.

MELVILLE M. PALMER

of Baker, State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Second Creek and Ruckles Creek, tributary of Powder River and Powder River, tributary of Snake River for the purpose of the irrigation of 56 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1890 for 10 acres; August 14, 1889 for 17 acres; 1888 for 9 acres and 1880 for 20 acres

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

5 acres in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter; 5 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter; 3 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northeast quarter and 14 acres in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Seven, Township Nine South, Range Forty-two and 29 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section Twenty-one, Township Eight South, Range Forty-two, All East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
