## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 15 , at page 461 ; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1879;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80 cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to one acre foot per calendar month to June 1 and four acre feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located in the NW4 NE4, Section 12, T. 9 S., R. 27 E., W. M., 3180 feet South and 100 feet East from the Center & Corner of Section 1.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in point of diversion approved July 18, 1966 and together with certificate 36598 supersedes certificate of water right 25171.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
