CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That PAUL KNOBLAUCH

of Richland, State of Oregon, 97870, has
a right to the use of the waters of Powder River

a tributary of Snake River for the purpose of
irrigation of 27.0 acres

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of
the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the
right thereby confirmed dates from 1900

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of one
cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be subject to all other conditions and
limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as
follows:

20.0 acres NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$
7.0 acres NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by the prior
certificate recorded at page 4289, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates,
NOT modified by the provisions of an order entered on April 1, 1958, approving
transfer application S-113 and canceling part of the right described by said prior
certificate. The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the
status of the water right in reference to ORS 540.610.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
