ov its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NWs SWz, Section 26, T. 18 S., R. 2 E., W. M., 50 feet Sout! and 460 feet East from the Wg Corner of Section 26.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second per acre,
