CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That W. L. SMITH

of Baker, State of Oregon has a right to the use of
the waters of Powder River, tributary of Snake River and Elk Creek, tributary of
Powder River
for the purpose of the irrigation of 108 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291;
that the priority of the right thereby ascertained dates from 1869 for 8 acres; 1908 for
20 acres; 1875 for 12 acres; 1876 for 12 acres; 1877 for 35 acres and 1906 for
21 acres

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed $1/40$ of one cubic foot
per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations
contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
(or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

8 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Twenty,
Township Nine South, Range Forty; 15 acres in the Northwest quarter of North-
east quarter; 7 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northeast quarter; 32 acres
in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter and 24 acres in the Northeast
quarter of Northeast quarter of Section One, Township Ten South, Range Thirty-
nine and 22 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section Six,
Township Ten South, Range Forty, All East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker
County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place
of use herein described.
