## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That

JOHN STRIGER

, State of

has a right to the use of

the waters of Salmon Croek, Mill or Waggie Creek, Spring Creeks, Landreth Spring and other springs, tributary of Powder River for the purpose of the irrigation of 240 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for

Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291;
that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1867 for 80 acres; 1867 for
20 acres and 1867 for 140 acres

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

40 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northwest quarter and 40 acres in the Northwest quarter of Section Three, Township Nine South, Range Thirty-nine: 40 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter; 40 acres in the Northwest quarter of Southeast quarter; 40 acres in the Southeast quarter of Section Thirty-three, Township Eight South, Range Thirty-nine, East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
