CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That O. F. WILLIAMS, HARRY L. HAWKINS, &
RICHARD G. MURRY

of Rt. 2, Box 36, Tidewater, State of Oregon, 97390, has made
proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of
an unnamed stream

a tributary of Alsea River for the purpose of
domestic use for three families, including the irrigation of lawn and garden
not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in area
under Permit No. 37523 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in
accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from
June 7, 1974
that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed
0.01 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.
The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 36, T. 13 S., R. 10 W., W. M.,
750 feet South and 2080 feet East from the NW Corner, Section 36

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second
per acre,

and shall
conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right
is appurtenant, is as follows:

Lot 5 (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$)
Section 36
T. 13 S., R. 10 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place
of use herein described. and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies
established by the Water Policy Review Board.
