## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

of North Powder, State of Oregin has a right to the use of the waters of Wolf Creek, tributary of Powder River

for the purpose of the irrigation of 83 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1884

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

38 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northwest quarter and 38 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section <u>Fifteen</u>: 2 acres in the Southwest quarter of Southwest quarter and L acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter of Section <u>Ten</u>, Township Six South, Range Thirty-nine East of Willametto Meridian, in Union County, Cregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
