CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That CHARLES HARVILL,

of Richland, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of the waters of EAGIE CREEK, a tributary of Powder River, for the purpose of irrigation of 48.5 acres of land,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume six, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1897 for 3.5 acres; 1901 for 12 acres; 1909 for 33 acres;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

1.5 acres in Northeast quarter of Northwest quarter; 7.5 acres in Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter; 7 acres in Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter; 16.5 acres in Southeast quarter of Northwest quarter; of Section Twenty-nine; 12 acres in Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter; 4 acres in Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section Thirty, Township Nine South, Range Forty-six East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
