## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

**This Is to Certify, That** EDGAR S. RUSSELL

of 3001 E. Long Street, Sweet Home, State of Oregon 97386, has  
a right to the use of the waters of an unnamed stream

a tributary of South Santiam River for the purpose of  
stock drinking directly from the source and is limited not to exceed 20 head

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for  
Linn County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of  
the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 18, at page 15; that the priority of the  
right thereby confirmed dates from 1852

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an  
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed be further limited  
to the provisions of Finding No. 55 of said Decree

The point of diversion is located in the - - - -

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as  
follows:


NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$   
as projected within Russell DLC 41  
Section 33  
T. 13 S., R. 1 E., W. M.

Being within that tract of land described as follows:  
Beginning 2821.50 feet South and 18.48 feet East of the Northwest corner of the  
Newton Russell DLC No. 41, Township 13 South, Range 1 East; thence South 89° 54'  
30" East 900.90 feet; thence North 0° 16' 30" West 940 feet; thence North 89°  
54' 30" West 900.90 feet; thence South 0° 16' 30" East 940 feet to point of  
beginning.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.  
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of  
use herein described.
