CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That FRANK ASHER

of PO Box 36, Mount Vernon, State of Oregon 97845, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of two springs

a tributary of John Day River for the purpose of stock

under Permit No. 39955 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from March 31, 1975

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second, being 0.005 cfs from each spring

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 6, T11S, R26E, WM; No. 1 - 2100 feet South and 2100 feet West, No. 2 - 2060 feet South and 1900 feet West both from NE Corner, Section 6

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.


A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 6
Township 11 South, Range 26 East, WM

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
