CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That Gilgian Reichen

of Salem , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of

Unnamed Spring a troutlery to Yamhill River for the purpose of domestic and irrigation ander Permit No. 5446 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon: that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 24, 1922;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes accuracy, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said perposes, and shall not exceed

0.03 cubic foot per second;

The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable volution system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same law's, shall be limited to one-cightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of incition.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appartment (or, if for other purposes, the place where the water is put to beneficial or), is aviolated: One (1) acre in the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (NEASE) of Section Six (6), Township Six (6) South, Range Three (3) West of the Willamette Meridian, in Yamhill County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of so tween described.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty yours from the class of smooths of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of receival under the large visiting at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby consecuted and limited.
