CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That GEO. F. YOUNG (Successor of J. B. Luster)

of North Powder, State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of North Powder River, a tributary of Powder River for the purpose of Irrigation

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 3 & 7, at page 252 & 44, that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from the year 1901 for Tract No. 1, and 1902 for Tract No. 2.

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 2.00 sec. ft from March 1st to July 1st and 1.13 sec. ft. from July 1st to October 1st of each year; the total quantity diverted during each irrigation season not to exceed 225 acre feet. (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract No. 1; under the Smith-McPhee and Tanner ditch: 15 1/2 acres in the NE 1/4 NW 1/4, 15 acres in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 4 Twp. 7 S. R. 39 E. W. 1., in Baker County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2; under the Kelsey-Wilson ditch: 22 1/2 acres in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4, 24 1/2 acres in the NE 1/4 NW 1/4, 1 acre in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4, 11 1/2 acres in the SE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 4 Twp. 7 S. R. 39 E. W. 1., in Baker County, Oregon.

(NOTE: This certificate is issued, in accordance with a decree of the Circuit Court for Union County, Oregon dated May 31st, 1924, to correct and supersede that certain certificate issued by the State Water Board May 9, 1917 to J. B. Luster, and recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Volume 2, page 1491, wherein the description of certain land was omitted.)

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
