CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That

ARCHDIOCESE OF PORTLAND IN OREGON

of 2838 East Burnside, Portland, State of Oregon, 97201, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of St. John Cemetery Well

a tributary of Newell Creek for the purpose of irrigation of 10.0 acres

under Permit No. G-6954 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from August 9, 1976 that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.13 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the well. The well is located in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 as projected within Holmes DLC 38, Section 5, T3S, R2E, WM; 950 feet North and 2,130 feet East from SW Corner Holmes DLC 38,

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- 2.8 acres SW 1/4 NW 1/4 as projected within Holmes DLC 38
- 7.2 acres NW 1/4 SW 1/4 as projected within Holmes DLC 38
- Section 5
- Township 3 South, Range 2 East, WM

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
