CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That C. E. Jones, Successor to Geo. W. Hutton

of _____, State of _____ has a right to the use of

the waters of Powder River, tributary of Snake River

for the purpose of the irrigation of 9 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
 _____ County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
 Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority
 of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1880

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
 amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1-40 of one cubic foot
 per second per acre; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations
 contained in said decree

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
 (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

9 acres in the East half of Northwest quarter of Section Nineteen, Township
 Eight South, Range Forty-two East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

(NOTE: This certificate is issued to correct and supersede that certain certificate
 issued to Geo. W. Hutton, February 15, 1923, and recorded in State Record of Water
 Right Certificates Volume 5, page 4246, and in Volume 2 of Baker County Record of
 Water Right Certificates, at page 667, in accordance with an order of the Circuit
 Court dated July 23rd, 1924, correcting a clerical error in the Powder River
 decree and in said former certificate, by changing the description to 9 acres in the
 E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 19, T. 8 S. R. 42 E. W. M., and C. E. Jones as successor to Geo.
 W. Hutton.)

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place
 of use herein described.
