CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That W.J. CODY

of Tygh Valley, State of Oregon 97063, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of Tygh Creek

a tributary of White River for the purpose of irrigation of 10.77 acres

under Permit No. 4368 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon: that the priority of the rights hereby confirmed dates from January 2, 1920

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.14 cubic foot per second; if available at the original point of diversion; NW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 3, Township 4 South, Range 13 East, WM, Mays Ditch 1 - 1,320 feet South and 10 feet East from W 1/4 Corner, Section 3

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4, Township 4 South, Range 13 East, Section 4, WM; 1,480 feet South and 60 feet East from NW Corner, Section 4

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eighthieth of one cubic foot per second per acre.

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:  
 2.67 acres NW 1/4 SE 1/4  
 8.10 acres SW 1/4 SE 1/4  
 Section 4  
 Township 4 South, Range 13 East, WM


This certificate is issued to confirm a change in point of diversion approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 13, 1965 and together with Special Order Volume 36, page 324, supersedes certificate of water right recorded at page 8486, Volume 8, State Record of Water Right Certificates

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
