CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That F. W. EBERLEIN

of 2056 Auburn St., Klamath Falls, State of Oregon 97502, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of North Fork Rogue River

a tributary of Rogue River for the purpose of domestic use for one family

under Permit No. 43415 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from August 25, 1977

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 34, T30S, R3E, WM; 800 feet North and 550 feet West from SE Corner SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 34

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to----- of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4
Section 34
Township 30 South, Range 3 East, WM

More explicitly described as Lot 4, Block A Rogue River Summer Home Site

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described. and is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Policy Review Board with an effective date prior to this right.
