a tributary of an unnamed stream (S. Fk. Burnt River) for the purpose of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of lawn and garden not to exceed one-half acre in area under Permit No. 43149 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from March 7, 1978 that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second
or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, T13S, R36E, WM; 1625 feet South and 2500 feet West from NE Corner, Section 12.
