## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

## This is to Certify, That John Biasca

of Marchfield , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Wallace Gulch or Ideal Springs

Wallace Gulch or Ideal Springs
a tributary of Coos River for the purpose of Domestic & Irrigation
under Permit No. 6667 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oreyon; that the priority of the right hereby
confirmed dates from February 16, 1925;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed

0.26 cubic foot per second;

The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where the water is put to beneficial use), is as follows: Three (3) acres in the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest

Quarter (STANT) of Section Twenty-eight (28); and Two (2) acres in Lot Two (2) of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Twenty-five South, Range Twelve West of the Willamette Meridian, in Coos County, Oregon.

The location of the point of diversion and the pipe line conveying the water to the above described lands is particularly described in Water Right Agreement dated April 26, 1919, between Rocco Biasca and wife, and John Biasca and wife, recorded on page 302 of book 83, Records of Deeds of Coos County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject: to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.
