CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to certify, That CARL H. DAVIS

of 680 Meadow View Drive, Williams, State of OR 97544, has made proof to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director, of a right to the use of the waters of winter run-off and a reservoir constructed under Permit R-7832

a tributary of Williams Creek for the purpose of waterfowl habitat including swan culture

under Permit No. 44231 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 14, 1979 that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.004 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 3, T39S, R5W, WM; 1450 feet South and 390 feet East from NW corner Section 3.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ----- of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4
Section 3
Township 39 South, Range 5 West, WM

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
