CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that

CHARLES T. WELP EDITH L. WELP

of ARLINGTON OR 97812 has a right to the use of the waters of ROCK CREEK a tributary of JOHN DAY RIVER for the purpose of IRRIGATION.

The right has been perfected under Permit 38739. The date of priority is OCTOBER 11, 1973. The right is limited to not more than 0.500 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The point of diversion is located in the

(point 1) SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 7, T 01 N, R 20 E, WM; 740 FEET NORTH & 2700 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 7 (point 2) LOT 4, SW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 7, T 01 N, R 20 E, WM; 1120 FEET NORTH & 770 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 7

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
