The right to the use of these waters has been perfected under Permit 38493. The date of priority is JULY 30, 1973. The right is limited to not more than 0.03 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND; BEING 0.02 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.01 CFS FOR MAINTENANCE OF FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEM or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The point of diversion is located in the

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 35, T 37 S, R 08 W, WM; 700 FEET SOUTH & 100 FEET EAST FROM W1/4 CORNER SECTION 35.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
