CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that

PAULINE DELISE CALLAHAN-FORRESTER
of PO BOX 0336 GLIDE, OR 97443
has a right to the use of the waters of LITTLE RIVER, TRIBUTARY OF
NORTH UMPQUA RIVER

for the purpose of DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY AND IRRIGATION.

The right to the use of these waters has been perfected
under Permit 45389. The date of priority is MARCH 4, 1980.
The right is limited to not more than 0.035 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND;
BEING 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC & 0.03 CFS FOR IRRIGATION
or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of
diversion from the source. The point of diversion is located as
follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 34, T 26 S, R 03 W, WM;
1130 FEET SOUTH & 1090 FEET EAST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 34

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the
amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands,
shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per
acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further
limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for
each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system
as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to
which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Total:	3.70	acres.					

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is
restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water
Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
