CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that FRANK B. ROOD,
of 2220 WILLANCE WAY, NORTH BEND, OREGON 97459, has a right to the use
of the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of WILLANCH CREEK, for
the purpose of DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY AND STOCK USE.

The right has been perfected under Permit 41631. The date of priority
is FEBRUARY 17, 1977. The right is limited to not more than 0.01
CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC AND 0.005 CFS FOR
STOCK WATER or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the
point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 18, T 25 S, R 12 W, W.M.;
2060 FEET SOUTH AND 840 FEET EAST FROM THE CENTER QUARTER CORNER
SECTION 18.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be
ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such
right is appurtenant, is as follows:

LOT 3 (NW 1/4 SW 1/4) DOMESTIC
NE 1/4 SW 1/4 STOCK
SECTION 18
TOWNSHIP 25 SOUTH, RANGE 12 WEST, W.M.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed
by certificate 53693, VOLUME 49, State Record of Water Right
Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water
Resources Director entered APRIL 12, 1988, approving transfer
application T-6019.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the
status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610
pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted
to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right
is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources
Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
