CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of ELK RIVER AND A SPRING, TRIBUTARY OF PACIFIC OCEAN, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 1.0 ACRE AND DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY.

The right has been perfected under Permit 41539. The date of priority is MARCH 3, 1977. The right is limited to not more than 0.015 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND; BEING 0.01 CFS FROM ELK CREEK FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.005 CFS FROM SPRING FOR DOMESTIC or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

LOT 3 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), SECTION 6, T 33 S, R 14 W, W.M.; SPRING - 225 FEET NORTH & 530 FEET WEST; RIVER - 435 FEET NORTH AND 135 FEET WEST BOTH FROM S1/4 CORNER SECTION 6.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

LOT 3 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4) 1.0 ACRE AND DOMESTIC SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 33 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
