CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DAVID J. AND JEANNINE G. ALEXANDER 4316 SW BOTTICELLI LAKE OSWEGO, OREGON 97034

confirms the right to use the waters of METOLIUS RIVER, a tributary of DESCHUTES RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATION OF LAWN OR NONCOMMERCIAL GARDEN NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF ACRE IN AREA.

The right has been perfected under Permit 48064. The date of priority is DECEMBER 15, 1983. The right is limited to not more than 0.01 cubic foot per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 10, T 13 S, R 9 E, W.M.; 150 FEET NORTH & 510 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 10.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.5 ACRE SECTION 10 TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 9 EAST, W.M.

LAND UPON WHICH WATER IS USED MORE EXPLICITLY DESCRIBED AS LOT 8, TRACT H, CAMP SHERMAN SUMMER HOMES.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
