CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That H. W. and NETTIE GOODELL
of Dixie, State of Oregon has a right to the use of
the waters of Dixie Creek, a tributary of Burnt River
for the purpose of Irrigation

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 6, at page 134; that the priority
of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1882

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed Three acre feet
per acre during any irrigation season (with the further limitations contained in
Paragraph 64 of said decree);

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
(or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

One and five tenths (1.5) acres in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Fifteen (15); Fifteen (15) acres in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$), Fourteen (14) acres in the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$), Five (5) acres in the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$) and Two (2) acres in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Sixteen (16), Township Thirteen (13) South, Range Forty-four (44) East of the Willamette Meridian, being a total of 37.5 acres.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
