## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That

JOHN KEMMLING

of Prineville

has a right to the use of

the waters of

McKay Creek, a tributary of Crooked River,

for the purpose of the irrigation of 15.75 acres of land, and domestic and stock use,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Crook County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the RECORD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 1, at page 449; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from the year 1874,

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed a reasonable amount for domestic and stock use, and two-tenths cubic foot per second for irrigation, the total cuantity being limited to four acre feet per acre during each year. The use hereunder shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:

3 cores in the  $SW_4^2$  of  $SW_4^2$ ; 12.75 acres in the  $SE_4^1$  of  $SW_4^1$ ; Section Fourteen (14) Township Thirteen (13) South Range Sixteen (16) East of Willamette Heridian, in Crook County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
