CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ROBERT AND MARILYN J. RICHARDS  
1306 INDIAN SUMMER  
VALINDA, CALIFORNIA 91744

confirms the right to use the waters of ROGUE RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for the purpose of IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE, DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO FAMILIES AND USE IN A CAMPSITE.

The right has been perfected under Permit 42434. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 6, 1977. The right is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.005 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC & CAMPSITE USE or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 11, T 35 S, R 7 W, W.M.; 1350 FEET NORTH AND 1140 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER SECTION 11.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
